#### Dear Church,

#### Where there is no vision, the people perish. Proverbs 29:18

Since my first year with you, I have encouraged us to dream big, to imagine how we may become the most vibrant, faithful Christian community we can be and then to ask for what resources we need to head in that direction. In the beginning, this made people nervous. And yet, the number and amount of pledges have increased every year. Some of the things we hoped for (a grand piano, a large-screen TV, an industrial dishwasher, a conventional dishwasher, furniture) just came to us, for free, out of the blue. Theologically, I interpret those as gifts of the Holy Spirit, honoring our shared ministry here. God has been very good to United Parish.

This year is no different. Our ministry teams have dreamed us into the future. And the requests ended up being \$155K above our current revenue. It can be daunting when you start dreaming out loud!

Our Stewardship and Budget Ministry Team has faithfully come up with a proposed budget that is within our reach. To achieve our goal, we need 100% pledging participation from all the people who share in our life together. We are also seeking a 15% increase in overall giving.

As Paul reminds us in his letter to Corinth, there is a grace in giving. As you look over this brochure and think about how United Parish graces your life, please consider how you can contribute. If you haven't pledged before, please give it a try. If you are already pledging, I invite you to consider whether you can increase your giving by even ½ percent or more.

I am continually grateful to be a part of this loving and justice-seeking community. It is exciting to be dreaming forward with you.
