Remembrance of Baptism and Profession of Faith Cathy & Paul Quackenbush Canty-Devavaram Family: Leann, Prabhu, Ashwin & Priya

- One: In our baptismal vows, we renounce the power of wickedness in our lives. Remembering this, let us pray together:
- All: Nourishing God, you tell us not to fear for you are with us. But we are so full of fear that we cannot love you with our whole heart. We use the freedom and power you have given us, not to resist evil, injustice, and oppression, but to rebel against your love to hurt our neighbors and ignore the cries of the needy.

Cleanse us of our fear. Feed us the courage to put our whole trust in your grace.

#### The Great Thanksgiving
