April 2020 Dear Beloved Siblings,

Grace and peace to you in this disorienting, disturbing and momentous time! This current season of global pandemic and social distancing has only increased my love and appreciation for our beloved community. The sense of connection, the yearning for collective spiritual comfort, strength, and sustenance has never felt more real to me as a pastor. I am grateful beyond measure for the good humor, ingenuity, deep faithfulness, ongoing encouragement, and unmitigated kindness of our staff and members.

While the church building is closed, I can assure you that our staff has been working as hard and faithfully as ever — even more so. In addition to learning new technologies and re-configuring worship for online access, we are working steadily with leadership about how to keep us all connected virtually and to respond financially to those in need.

With the loss of \$8,000 a month in building usage fees from outside groups, we have, like everyone else, entered a new financial reality. On the recommendation of our Stewardship & Budget Ministry Team and with the overwhelming approval of our Council and Ministry Team conveners, we applied for relief funds from the Paycheck Protection Program, so that we may retain our current staff and continue to pay our part-time, hourly workers. Church employees are not eligible for unemployment insurance, so our leadership wanted to avoid releasing anyone. We give thanks upon just learning that we have been approved for the loan.

Our own financial gifts to United Parish have never been more important. I am keenly aware that some of us may need to reduce our financial contribution right now. Some of us may be able to give more. Both are faithful responses. I know that regardless of where our economy heads, we will, like the early Christians, remain "together and hold everything in common" (Acts 2:44) as a beloved patch of God's kingdom here on Earth. As always, I invite you to pray about what is the best, most faithful way for you to continue to participate in our common life. I am happy to talk about it with you individually, if you like.

Gathering electronically also gives us new opportunities to pledge electronically, which saves us paper, staff and volunteer time. If possible, please make both your service and financial pledges online by Consecration Sunday, May 17. If you need help, just give us a call. Until then, I express my unending gratitude to be in this together with you. I thank God continually for our United Parish community.
