Prayer of Confession unison — In honor of the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi, we say his prayer. Together, we confess the ways we have gotten out of step with God and seek to re-center ourselves in the Love of God.

Lord, make us instruments of your peace. Where we have sown the seeds of hatred, let us sow love; where there is injury, let us sow pardon; where there is discord, union; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy. Grant that we may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood as to understand; to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive; it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life...

Words of Remembering (from Korea) unison

Together, we re-member ourselves as the body of Christ.

Prayer of Consecration (from Guatemala)

Sharing of the Meal (from South Africa)

Together we share this holy meal, re-membering ourselves as the living body of Christ.
