Agape Global Health for Haiti

Because the small Haitian island of La Gonave, is where Agape Global Health is located, is a haven to escape the violence in Port-au-Prance, Agape facing an influx of displaced people. The numbers of people in need of medical services keep growing.

Agape brings hope through:

- The Agape Clinic
 - A health clinic specializing in prenatal and newborn care.
- Menstrual health education
 - o Teaching girls and women about their bodies and menstruation.
 - Providing washable, reusable menstrual kits empowering girls to stay in school when they're menstruating.
- Clean water access
 - Training and equipping women to clean water using high-efficiency filtration systems to supply safe drinking water to families.



Doctors from the Boston medical community – including a parishioner from *United Parish in Brookline* – have visited *Agape Global Health* in the past and continue to consult.

Gift #1: Agape Global Health for Haiti

Brookline Food Pantry

None of our neighbors should go to bed hungry.

Every week, the *Brookline Food Pantry* provides food to *over 700 households* — families with young children, elders on fixed incomes, new arrivals to our community, and longtime neighbors facing unexpected hardship. The need keeps growing. <u>Especially in the face of today's government cuts.</u>

They also prepare weekend meal packs for local students who rely on school meals during the week, and deliver food to Brookline residents who are elderly or ill and can't come to the *Brookline Food Pantry* themselves.

For years, United Parish has stood alongside the Brookline Food Pantry through food drives, the Walk for Hunger, and financial support.

In this moment of rising need, food matters more than ever.

Gift #2: Brookline Food Pantry

Dhansa Maweni School, Kenya

Many families simply cannot afford the fees required for public school. The Dhansa Maweni School opens its doors to children ages three to fourteen, offering a place to learn, to grow, and to dream.

Four devoted teachers and one maintenance worker keep the school running, teaching everything from math and science to English, Swahili, creative arts, and Christian religious education. They also make sure children receive breakfast porridge — sometimes the only dependable meal of the day.

Love and steady support is a lifeline — helping children break free from poverty and build a future filled with promise. This little school creates ripples of opportunity that can help lift children — and their families — out of poverty.

- \$25 pays one week of a teacher's salary.
- \$50 provides one year of a student's school supplies.
- \$100 provides one month of breakfast porridge.

A *United Parish in Brookline* congregant visits the school every year to witness the inspiring children and the stellar work of the staff.

ELM focuses on high-impact solutions:

- Expanding renewable energy,
- Strengthening protections for forests and wetlands,

- Holding state leaders accountable to Massachusetts' climate commitments.

Horizons for Homeless Children

Horizons for Homeless Children leads the fight in Massachusetts to help alleviate the trauma and stress of homelessness on both children and their families. They provide high-quality early education, opportunities for play (so important), support for parents, and crucial advocacy on behalf of our neighbors going through tough times.

Support for Horizons for Homeless Children provides essential:

- Early education
- Help & Support for Parents
- Play in Shelter
- Advocacy

Gift #5: Horizons for Homeless Children

International Institute of New England (IINE)

Some leaders are slamming the doors on immigration. Others know that with newcomers, our cities, states and country grow stronger – that's fundamental to the American story.

The International Institute of New England helps refugees and immigrants build safe, stable, self-sufficient lives in Boston and New England after surviving war, persecution, disaster, or displacement.

From the moment families arrive, IINE provides:

- Housing support
- English classes
- Job training
- Legal assistance
- Help navigating schools and healthcare

The work of *IINE* is practical and immediate: getting people settled, connected, and ready to thrive in a new home. Each year, they support thousands of newcomers rebuilding their lives after war, persecution, or disaster.

As Axios reported this fall, *IINE* has already lost more than \$10 million in federal support. Yet *IINE* continues to welcome and support thousands of newcomers because, as they note, the need is growing — not shrinking.



Gift #6: International Institute of New England

Native Land Conservancy

The Native Land Conservancy is the first Native-run land trust east of the Mississippi. Dedicated to protecting and restoring land in the homelands of the Wampanoag and Massachusett peoples, they work to conserve forests, rivers, and shorelines while also preserving access for cultural, educational, and ecological purposes.

Their approach is rooted in Indigenous stewardship — caring for the land in ways that sustain both the environment and the communities connected to it. By returning land to Native care and protecting it for future generations, they model a powerful form of healing and justice.

Support for the *Native Land Conservancy* strengthens Indigenous leadership and helps safeguard the land we all depend on.

Honor the land by supporting those who have long protected it.



History is complicated. *United Parish in Brookline* stands on land once stewarded by the Massachusett indigenous people. Our *Congregational* and *Methodist* ancestors supported brutal boarding schools that sought to erase Native identity. We can't change history, but we can respond with honesty, respect, and action today.

Gift #7: Native Land Conservancy

World Food Program (WFP)

The United Nations World Food Program is the world's largest humanitarian organization focused on ending hunger, providing food and nutrition support to people affected by conflict, disaster, and poverty in more than 120 countries.

Alongside emergency response, WFP partners with communities through school meals, nutrition programs, and climate-resilient food initiatives.

Global hunger is rising as war, displacement, economic instability, and climate-driven disasters push millions to the edge. WFP prioritizes those hardest to reach, especially children and families cut off from stable food access.

Today, they are leading lifesaving emergency relief in several crises, including Gaza, where access to food and clean water is critically limited.
